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### Overview

Established in 2011, the Master of Public Administration and Nonprofit Management at SUNY Buffalo State University (hereinafter MPA Program) prepares a diverse body of preservice and in-service professionals for positions of leadership in local, national, and international public service. The program cultivates values of accountability, ethics, and social equity through learning, service projects, and research. The program contributes to the body of knowledge and advances the quality of governance.

The MPA Program is housed within the Department of Political Science, Public Administration, and Planning (P3). The department is one of 20 academic departments and interdisciplinary units housed within the School of Arts and Sciences (SAS) at SUNY Buffalo State University. The MPA is offered at the main campus in the City of Buffalo. All students—whether pre-service or in-service—must meet the same degree requirements, including expected competencies, curriculum, grading standards, and any other program requirements.

Courses are scheduled and formatted to accommodate the schedules of working professionals. Courses are offered in-person during weekday evenings (after 4:30 PM) and Saturday mornings. Courses are offered online during the Summer and the January mini term. All courses are platformed via the Brightspace learning management system. In fact, most courses in the program are offered in a hybrid modality, which leverages the best of the in-person and online instructional settings. Because hybrid courses economize on in-person instructional time, students may enroll in two classes per evening.

With its emphasis on research, statistics, human resource management, strategic planning, and administrative processes, the MPA prepares students for management positions in all sectors. Our MPA alumni work in federal, state, and local government; nonprofit agencies; consulting firms; private foundations; and the business sector. The core curriculum combines the theory and practice of public administration, public finance, human resource management, quantitative and qualitative research, and a thorough grounding in intergovernmental relations.

### Degree & Certificate Programs

#### Undergraduate

Public Administration Minor: The 18 credit-hour Minor in Public Administration and Nonprofit Management (PAD) introduces students from all disciplines to the core elements of public administration and nonprofit management. The minor is designed to prepare students for careers in the nonprofit and government sectors and/or graduate study in public administration and public affairs. Some students who have completed the PAD minor have pursued their MPA at Buffalo State or at other universities.

MPA 4+1 Accelerated Pathway: The MPA in Public and Nonprofit Management 4+1 accelerated pathway offers qualified undergraduate students an expedited and cost-effective opportunity to pursue a graduate degree in Public Administration. The pathway initiates graduate-level coursework at the undergraduate level, providing qualified students with a seamless entry to the master's degree program and an accelerated course of study toward an advanced degree.

#### Graduate

Master of Public Administration and Nonprofit Management: The program offers three tracks: Public Administration (government), Nonprofit Management, and International Public Management. The Public Administration Track includes courses in city and county management, administrative law, comparative public administration, public policy, and other topical courses designed to prepare students for a career in public service. The Nonprofit Administration Track includes courses in nonprofit governance, fundraising and grants management, and the history of the voluntary sector to prepare students to effectively plan, develop, manage, evaluate, and lead nonprofit programs. The International Public Management Track includes courses in International Public Management and NGO Management & International Development to prepare student for careers with international non-governmental organizations, international organizations, and government agencies working in the international arena.

The program, totaling 36 credit hours, includes seven required core courses (21 credit hours); four courses from a selected track (12 credit hours); and 3 credit hours for the MPA project.

#### Certificates

Public Management Graduate Certificate: The Advanced Certificate in Public Management provides students with an advanced course of study at the graduate level concentrating on the conceptual, technical, and professional education and skills required for administrative and leadership positions in governmental offices and not-for-profit agencies. The program, totaling 15 credit hours, includes three required core courses (9 credit hours) and two electives (6 credit hours) taken from Public Administration (PAD) graduate courses. Transfer credit may be given for one or both of the elective courses.

Disaster and Emergency Management Graduate Certificate: The Advanced Certificate in Disaster and Emergency Management is a fully online program that covers theory, legal structure, local, state, and federal doctrine, planning, and practice of disaster and emergency management. The program is designed to provide individuals with the conceptual and technical knowledge needed for positions related to disaster and emergency management in public agencies, nonprofit organizations, private businesses, or international humanitarian agencies.

The program totals 15 credit hours that includes four core courses (12 credit hours) and one elective (3 credit hours). Transfer credit may be given for the one elective course.
